2010 District Populations

San Joaquin County last redistricted in 2011 with a supervisorial-based process. The populations of each district at that time were based on the 2010 Decennial Census.

As the following table shows, utilizing the American Community Survey (ACS) data from the 2006-2010 vintage which would be used in the 2011 redistricting, there was no district which had a more than 50% Citizen Voting Age Population (CVAP) ethnic/racial subset. The highest CVAP figures were in district 1 and 4 at 40.5% and 25.4% Latino CVAP, respectively.

Population Growth and Current Deviations

The Statewide Database has released the final California Census population, reallocating the state prison population, providing the final dataset that Cities and Counties must use to comply with the Fair Maps Act. This final population identifies the whole count of persons and where they resided as of April 1, 2020. Redistricting Partners has concluded the work of placing this data into the census blocks, block groups, and tracts.¹

Based on this data, the county has grown by 92,006 residents, or 13.4%, since the last decennial census. This is significantly higher than the state population change of 6.1%.

¹ These counts are based on the 2020 Census geography. There may be slight differences as many censusblocks were consolidated.

District 5 saw the largest increase of residents with 40,107, and the district with the slowest growth was District 4, which gained 7,226 residents. All five county districts experienced a growth in population.

2020 Population and Growth

With the 2020 population of 777,312 the ideal population for each district is 155,462. The seat with the largest population is District 5 at 177,343 (+14.1% from the ideal district population) and the smallest is District 4 at 143,589 (-7.6% from the ideal districting population), placing the county at a total of 21.7% deviation, outside of the 10% maximum required deviation range.


The data used to determine the size of Ethnic and Racial subgroups utilized for Voting Rights Act calculations, have been finalized for the current redistricting cycle. As with the 2010 data, this does show that District 1 is nearly a majority-minority Latino seat, with a current Latino CVAP of 47.7%.
