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Good evening chair.

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So yes we did receive some public comment.

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Through the redistricting email account.

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I will summarize those for you, excluding off topic spam and administrative notifications.

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We have for one we received an email from Nancy callous Dini recommending that San Joaquin County us representative district be represented by one us representative.

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Secondly, we received an email from Brian waddle asking if the map submissions, need to be error free.

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Third, we received an email from Jacqueline Shah requesting the number of APN, these are parcels with rural voters asked asking, which ones are agricultural.

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In a subsequent email Mrs Smith shot, including a map and explain that it represented agricultural industry and veterans.

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And finally we received an email from Nicole Ames with comments and questions about housing assistance.

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We also receive proposed Matt submitted by the public.

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And we received a number of them that the redistricting partners consultant will review in today's presentation. Under the public publicly submitted maps.

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Thank you.

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Thank you very much. Moving on to the next item direct member disclosures, do we have any disclosures. Yes, ma'am. It's very.

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pretty much any other disclosures back.

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I gave a presentation on redistricting on October six certain community in their community center.

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And in addition, I talked. I've talked with term limited board supervisors when, as well as Miller, as well as wins chief of staff to hear their thoughts on how

effective destructing aren't districts are

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miss my bed any anyone else.

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And we're going to do this together with the community contacts, I have to, I'm going to be meeting once I get the phone call from the residence at Del Webb in Mantega, they would like to gather some information on the redistricting I'm just waiting for,

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for their call and order to make that contact and have the ability to talk to them. On Thursday, October 28 I will be speaking to Mantega sunrise Kiwanis and giving them the action in regards to the redistricting as it applies to the Board of Supervisors

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in San Joaquin County.

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Okay. Any anyone else.

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Yes.

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And you know, I also spoke with.

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I also spoke with anyone else.

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No, no one online

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online at this time. Thank you very much. We're going to move to item eight This is the Voting Rights Act section two discussion barrel.

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A come forward and provide us the information that Air Force to this evening.

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Good evening everybody so excited to finally be at the meeting where we're really doing the map so this is this is our big moment.

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Okay, so I'm going to do a pretty quick presentation.

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The goal of the presentation is to make sure that as you move forward with the drawing of the maps that each decision that you make is informed. I also want to make sure that you know that you're supported in those decisions by both myself and redistricting

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partners in terms of ensuring that each decision that you make is in fact compliant with all of the various things we have to be compliant with so that's the goal.

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So, and some of this, you already know I'm going to reiterate it to the extent that it helps us the Voting Rights Act puts it in context so we know to successfully read district account.

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Read district to county. We need to adopt boundaries for the districts that are substantially unequal and population so right we understand we've got an increase in population.

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So what we're doing is we are now increasing the population in the nice district and those need to be substantially equal so that's kind of required item one.

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But as we do that, we also have to comply with the US Constitution, the California Constitution and the federal voting rights act so that is a lot of layers that we're going to consider each time we consider a map.

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So, I provided you a memo and this is just kind of a, an, frosting on top of the memo that is the cupcake so we'll kind of look at it that way. Okay.

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So what we did is, in the opposite county councils we had an analysis performed of the census data, and of the historical voting patterns within the county.

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So after that analysis, we are now taking that analysis and we're working directly with redistricting partners, so that we can advise you and ultimately advise the board to make sure that all of that historical information in the census analysis is included.

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So the analysis showed us that, to avoid a section to voters Rights Act violation. We need to drive district one very carefully. So, I am not here to give you, you know every bit of the voters Rights Act, not to be flipping back, we can Google that right.

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My job is to take that voters Rights Act and make sure you understand what it means

for you in this map so that's what we're doing.

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So that's what the analysis showed us is that we have a very. We have a potential for violation in district one. And that's what we're going to be really careful about the other districts populations don't set us up for that same kind of risk.

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So we're going to go ahead and I have a very quick slideshow again it's just going to kind of support us so for district one there's currently a Latino voting age population of 47.7%.

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And at that percentage, the Latino vote in district one is being heard. So, that district is working. It is currently compliant under the Voting Rights Act.

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So, we press the big button one time, and we get motivated, they've gotten one time, okay.

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So, as we read dr district one with that risk in mind right that's, that's the context within which were living.

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We have three requirements that are in place to as we drive district when we want to consider these three requirements so that's what I'm going to go through quickly.

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They are in essence in the memo. I'm also going to verbally give them to you so we're going to use all of our learning types tonight plan.

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Alright.

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So, first the Latino voting age, like I said, is working, 47.7%. So, our first rule, our first requirement the first constraint we're going to operate under is that the Latino eligible voter percentage in district One should not be reduced.

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The reason it should not be reduced in voters right sec terms, is that it's an effective opportunity district so what does all this mean, again we're going to go through this quickly Latino is defined in the census so that means people who reported.

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And it's a little nuance, but essentially people who reported Hispanic or Latino, regardless of race, they self reported that in the census. That is what Latino

means in terms of the census and of course in terms of eligible voters, those are people who

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are legally can cast ballots so that's the percentage are really focused on. So this requirement means that to remain compliant.

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We cannot reduce that percentage.

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Below 47.7%, and if it's possible what we want to see we'll talk about that more as we actually want to strengthen it. So we want to preserve and strengthen that Latino voting age population to avoid a violation of section to.

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So, what is an opportunity district right I'm saying it's operating it's working. It's working as an opportunity district so what is that essentially an opportunity district is when a district has a minority group, in this case we're obviously talking

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about Latinos, and they have shown in past elections that they are able to successfully as a group, elect candidates of their choice, we see that in district one and if we drop that percentage, there's an assumption that they are not going to be successful

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in in electing a candidate of their choice, and therefore if we drop percentage down what we're doing is we're diluting their vote.

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And that is where we end up in a section two analysis or section two violation problem.

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So, to get into more detail on that but I'm not going to that's where you would look in the memo and you'd identify the gimbals tests. The gimbals tests gets us we walk through that analysis we end up where district one is and then we realize that's what

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we're trying to preserve an opportunity district so I'm always happy to answer more detailed questions on that. The memo kind of breaks it down. We're breaking it down even even further.

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Okay, so the second requirement, when we are redefining district. One is the district needs to remain an opportunity district right so that means we need to be 47.7% Latino voting age or higher.

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Right. In, and there is a to what percentage essentially that this is included for your information, the key information is there at the bottom district one is effective so we need to, it doesn't need to exceed 50 and needs to.

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We need to identify where it where it works, it works at 47.7, and we want to see a percentage higher than that so 47.7 is essentially our floor in some districts.

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We don't see it in district one when you don't see that they're an effective voting district what you have to do is you both have to increase that percentage.

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And then you also have to actually buffer that sometimes up to their court cases that have it up to the mid 50s, and what you're doing then as you're buffering for actually low voter turnout and there's some various other factors that actually can be

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This actually can be a very complicated analysis, we don't see that in district one so I'm just laying out for you. The floor is 47.7 for the Latino voting age for district one.

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And we want to see it, if possible, up higher. I think what we're going to see tonight are maps to get you into the 15.3 15.8 rains and that's what you want to see that's going to strengthen and preserve that opportunity district for the Latino voting

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age population.

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OK,

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so now the third one, and this is kind of like in the land of, of, kind of obvious but I put it in any way. So, we know that we have an increase in population, as we increase that population we have to do it in a way that also increases of course that

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load Latino voting age population but to state what you guys are experts in now is when we do that, we have to increase it in a way that of course considers uniting neighborhoods in coins right so back to the beginning.

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We're back to coin rate so that's where we're just going to flag, you if you just

say hey we're going to increase population and that gets our percentage.

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We also don't have to do that in a way that protects unites neighborhoods and boys. So, how is this going to work right. You don't need to become experts in the voting rights.

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Voting Rights Act. So the way that it's worked as I have worked with redistricting partners so the maps that are going to be presented to you tonight are compliant, and so forth.

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So the way that we've operationalize This is we've gone ahead and put that set of requirements into the maps that you'll be presented with tonight. The reason that we want to flag it give you a little bit of education so you're making those informed choices

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is that, as you go to potentially modify those maps based on, on, you know, obviously you're informed as, as you make changes to this map. I want you to be aware of this.

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So if we say hey flag on the play right we're looking at those percentages, you have an understanding of what that means.

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And, you know, I want you to remember that both redistricting partners and I are here to answer this question so if you say I really want to see this shift or I really want to see this, we certainly can look at it, and will consider it but we are always

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working within the constraints of the Constitution, including the federal voting rights act so I am happy to take any questions or if there's anything you want to focus in on I'm happy to discuss that further.

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But I am open to any questions that you have a question I have, it's more of an educational question I guess and for myself and the entire diet is.

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We're going to be provided information coming from redistricting partners, but when we look at the group of Hispanic population of the voting voting age, are they pretty much concentrated in one location or they spread out through the entire district

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are all pretty much in one location is that, so I'm definitely going to hand that

over to the demographers, we do have that information, I'm just curious.

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So I'm going to let the smart people talk and I'm going to sit down.

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Thank you very much for your presentation.

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answer your question they're mostly mostly concentrated in a lot of the district ones that you'll see the draft maps in central and southern Stockton, there are pockets, all throughout the county, but you really, When you draw a compliant but the section

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you want it to look like other seats, you don't want to have lots of fingers and legs and arms and beaks and strange shapes to go. Right. So that's one of the reasons we drew the district ones and most of the health plans, very compact and kind of to

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act as a hub or a center point that all the other districts kind of rotate around.

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That's a little more answer than your question but no and I think it's important because it's just you know how, what is the concentration, are we looking at one thing because it becomes difficult, and I and I know that, understand that you're going to

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provide that information to us. But as we tend to if we were going to look at it from the Dyess, and we start to look at those numbers and all that then things start to spread.

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And then all of a sudden you do not have contiguous wines.

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They may just clarify to the chair, when I'm talking about 47 I'm talking about district one.

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Okay, so we're talking district by district so read the answer was kind of both in regards to district one and then the county but ok so i just want to be, I don't want to thank you very much for, for clarification.

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Is there any other questions. Yes, sir. roster.

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I did have a question about the potential Jeopardy that may be facing this process, if we are presented with three draft maps as we have been tonight with 15.8%, all three of them, I think had the same percentage.

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If through the process of moving the lines, we drop closer to the current floor of 47.6, whatever it is.

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In other words, if we move off a 50.8 for some other reason for a reason that is supported by the process but that does reduce it from 50.8. Is there any Jeopardy to us, or to the process.

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I'm seeing more legally I think we're going to switch out here tag. If we decide on a map that ends at 48.5 is someone going to come forward later and say, the redistricting commission was presented with three maps that has over 50%.

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They brought us out of 48, and that by itself is a college for some action, a great question, and I, and I appreciate that your can contextualizing and in terms of of a risk right because anytime a lawyer stands and gives you advice, we're giving you

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a risk analysis right there. We live in the gray area. So, so to answer your question.

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Anyone can anyone.

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The question is will they win. And, and my answer to you is, if that hypothetical happened, we, we were presented with 53 50.8 maths, and for district one, and we dropped down to 48 and, and here's why.

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And we have a good record of it as at the rack and the district is otherwise compliant meaning it is, it is compact it is popular you know we're close to the audio population we're meeting all of those layers of requirements that we were talking about.

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Then, although they could make a challenge I don't believe they would be successful. So what I would, what I would say is I think for the in that scenario, the county is very defensible.

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I think the district would be found to be compliant with the Voting Rights Act. Now, if we had no reason at all.

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And we didn't have a basis and we said, you know, we just want to cut this out because it makes the shape of a dinosaur, we probably would not be defensive or a visionary and permission.

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And, you know, and and I have used redistricting to drive dinosaur so you can do that. It was not compliant with section to that. So, that is where we're going to really try and make sure that we have a clear record as to the decisions that we're making.

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But I do believe in that hypothetical you would be defensible, and we would be compliant I, I guess what I want to just end with two is that when we are asking these questions and playing through these hypotheticals.

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With the Voting Rights Act does its entire purpose is to ensure there's no action in redistricting and other various actions that dilute the vote. So if so we won't want to dilute the vote now, so we can move those percentages but we're not going to see

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a dilution to the point that it's not an effective district in terms of opportunity definitions. Thank you for the fullness of your answer that great question, or anyone on the diocese has any other questions.

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Anyone online. Yes Mr Mooney.

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We all, you always put this up there well somebody could sue it you know sue for.

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What are the odds with somebody, or what's the, what would the advantage to somebody Suan be I mean except for representation i mean is there really a founding that I like to spend the money for it.

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Oh, well.

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Oh, you and I should talk offline.

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No, sir, remember any challenge to the Voting Rights Act is, is, is a position taken to protect the vote to ensure that something didn't dilute the vote so the claim would really need to encapsulate that the county's action.

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Took a minority group who was being effective again was effectively able to adopt a candidate of their choice. And we took actions to specifically dilute their vote, and that would need to be the basis of their claim.

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And, and if that happened what we would be forced to do is there would be a lawsuit and we would be in a holding pattern and they would be certainly costs.

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and having to go through the process again under generally the optics within a court battle so there is actually, there is a place in California. This is the current.

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It just went through this. And so in fact they drew and that was that was challenged and in fact, they didn't have a good basis for the challenge.

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They then had to redraw them within the context of a court case which is, you know, it's a Herculean effort by it, a jurisdiction so we don't want to do it.

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We also would never want there to be a finding that we've made a decision that's diluted the vote in any way so we're particularly careful about it, or yes we're My point is if we don't go below that 40 said as long as we keep it above, 47, where it is

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now.

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I'll be okay right yeah i mean i think there's both the letter of the law and the spirit of law and so what we're going to be really advocating is that while the letter of the law, is there a court cases that interpret the federal voting rights x are

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always very careful about those, those are very clear that we want to see it. Both maintained and strengthened and, and when I say that I would like to see.

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I'd like to see us bolster that just a little bit because we do have court cases that tell us that we are always needing to be cognizant of things like low voter turnout and other factors that are listed in your memo where we do see that in district one

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so we would like to see it.

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preserved and strengthen so I'd like to feel that a buffer there I think that makes us even more defensible in any challenge because it really shows that we wanted to ensure that no vote was deleted or good very good, like say part was just.

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What do you really want to challenge some of this stuff I mean I don't know, I think, maybe it's not always about whether it pencils out right there are certainly, you know, pots of money for for federal suits or suits against counties and we see it they're

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funded in various ways. So, unlike in in business practice where you say oh well that doesn't pencil out so you do a risk analysis based on the likelihood that somebody is economically going to make that decision.

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Instead what we see in redistricting and voting rights challenges is there may be a regional estate, some kind of pattern that that a group of trying to forward so we certainly don't want to try and predict that.

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So we're just going to be HIPAA compliant.

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Any other questions.

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By the way, give, give anyone, any reason to, to enable sale in there, done that.

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And we can compare and contrast we'd like. But they're all. All three are based on publicly submitted maps right, but we have no comparison. I mean, if we had an opportunity.

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So we can, we can look at current other districts options as well.

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Again, it looks a lot like the current district lines.

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There's a slight difference because Lodi is in the teal district, the the Western District rather than in district for that which would be the, I guess the lighter green.

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But you still see you see the two Stockton seats.

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And the magenta district is very similar to district five, which has Mountain House.

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Part of Mantega I believe and, of course, Tracy,

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this district map again has is a little bit different, has like a northern agrarian

rural district, based in Lodi with a little bit of Stockton has a similar district in northern Stockton has a district one or similar district to district one.

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And then you have a Western, or sorry, an Eastern teal district. That includes repin way through up and kind of the rural areas, and again you have the magenta district that includes Mountain House part of Antica, and your Tracy and I.

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22,000 over. So, To start with, couldn't be a good basis.

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Here's another map very similar to the one we've already seen.

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And now we're going to get into a little bit of coin submissions. This one is the London area.

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Very cool and enclosed community was their submission on the description.

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And I think a lot of Linden is included here and most of the district plans will be seeing

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this district is community. Community area of River Island,

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I believe, again, this district, most of the time will be included with Tracy sometimes it may move into Western District depending on the draft plan.

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Repeat.

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Again, you're seeing a lot of these this

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district like this with the seven with Lodi connected to rip rip in and so on.

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With a Tracy. This looks like it has part of laser been part of Antica and then again to to Stockton seeds and then most of Mantega most of Lathrop is in the teal district,

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this, this, this plan is, I think, again similar it, the magenta district comes across, and take some more of the aggro the eastern areas of the county.

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And this one draws Mountain House up into a seat with laser up and Mantega and Western Delta.

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For more,

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this.

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It's the whole county.

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I think that may be a plan for the statewide commission to think about.

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And the final map that we're going to go go through, is this one. Again, this has an interesting U shaped around Stockton, where it takes in most of the Delta Lodi.

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And I think touches on some of the Eastern census designated places, but then build the district, the blue district, based in Tracy Mountain House and part of a throat.

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And then has the two Stockton seats that you've seen in almost every single plan. And then this yellow district that is most authentic it looks like part of Southern Stockton and goes over into Ripon an Escalade.

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Those are the draft plans that have come forward since we've last seen each other.

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And one of the things I wanted to do in the presentation is go through kind of the plans that we elevated the public. Can we just go back to that. Sorry.

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Yeah, that slide please. So, if I'm assuming, and this is just an assumption on my part, that if we look at, at the blue that would be district five and the, what I would these be number.

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Do you have any idea, I mean I think you would probably if you were looking to the current lines, the blue district would be district five, the magenta district would be district one, the teal will be two.

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I guess I wouldn't make the, I mean sorry the light green would be to the teal would be three and yellow before.

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I think the to the yellow districts.

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I think technically loader Lodi and not technically Lodi is in for right now.

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So it's a question of like how you'd number is. Those two. Okay.

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Yes, sir.

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Chris were any of the publicly submitted maps that we just looked at evaluated against the era requirement.

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These warrant.

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We received them in the last couple days.

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But we will evaluate them, and come up with come out with a basically a data set for each of them with deviations and and see that totals. Thank you.

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Question Chairman, Mike Morell it.

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Yes Mr more went just just for clarity for everyone.

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Are we going to use color coding, from now on.

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And you're so can we get like a legend that just spells it out so we can continue so everyone knows, clean myself and the public. What color is we're going to correspond

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unless we number, I'm only going to use colors because of that that's the district or maps. But as you'll see going forward all the draft maps are numbered one through five.

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Okay.

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You understand that Mr more went.

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Yes.

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Thank you. Is anyone else online they have a question, Ballinger.

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Thank you for having this academy.

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Yes sir Mr Krinsky.

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I'm sorry I had a question I had my hand raised. He saw Hernandez.

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Yes, Miss Fernando.

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I've seen in our first presentation we were trying to say that we weren't going to be diluting district one.

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How, how does that happen if we can draw these maps and then named them totally different, a different district numbers has.

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I guess my question is, is there a rule that number one that you make district, one has to remain in that area.

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District two has to remain in a certain area, or.

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I mean because of the map that I'm looking at right now that they're sharing i mean it's it's a total different map. I mean, districts are in total different spots.

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So these are just the publicly submitted maps as Commissioner Oscar pointed out these haven't been evaluated for VR a compliance at this time. But just looking at this map, the magenta district.

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I don't think would hit the would have a seat Latino see map of over 47.7, given the districts that we've drawn in included in the draft maps that are coming, coming soon.

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Okay. Just a reminder, I allowed the question to be as a half. But going forward. The questions will only be addressed to those on the Dyess and not to the alternate.

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So, just for clarity as we continue and making sure that we're doing the process correctly, I apologize. I'm sorry.

So just some caveats to the answer to start. This is the first time we've used the fair maps act. It's the first time we've had public mapping tools like distributor and others available free to the public image nationwide.

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But I would say that, San Joaquin has had.

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I would say similar outreach and similar number of maps submitted for other counties, its size.

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I think

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in some counties, if you can believe it, have four or five maps and or three times the size of San Joaquin at this moment.

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The where we've seen the most will for the clients that we were working with.

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I think the city of La has the most and it's over well over 200, but they are also much larger than the county of San Joaquin right and

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so I think San Joaquin has done a really good job of doing public outreach the we've had really good.

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I think pretty good attendance, both in person and online, and the number of maps, I think you'll only see it, and more of an increase as we start introducing draft maps.

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We've seen throughout the state that the COI submissions those the ones we've gone through.

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We haven't hasn't had as much submissions as we kind of thought. But I think it's because when you start introducing draft lines and you start creating about, you know, a border and saying you're in this district in your maybe your friends or neighbors

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or another, or your family's in another. Then you people are much more engaged and much more interested. So I think it's just kind of the process, and I would say that, given that we've I think had 13 new maps emissions in the last two weeks is like you're

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you're starting to see that crescendo of public comment

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back.

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So, these have been interesting maps, presented by the public, and in some one case for example I noticed that the title gave a clue to how the dryer was thinking when it was ag for all.

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Looking at publicly submitted maps, taking into consideration the Voting Rights Act, and trying to make sure we're in compliance, of course, so that any draft map we show you could be passed, and with me, legal muster.

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And with me, legal muster. And so it's taking into consideration those themes that you provided us trying to look at the schools of maps that have come forward.

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Throughout the process so that we can give you options, and then you can, you know, go. I was hoping tonight we can go through each of those options, and you can say, I like Plan A or I like Plan C or whatever it is.

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And we don't like it as a commission we don't want to see this other plan come forward, where it's, you know, thank you for the thought experiment, but it didn't work.

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And so for our next session.

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It would be great to focus in on one or two of these draft maps and say, I really like this but you need to you need to make these changes.

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For our next round so maybe we have, Matt, a two and Matt be two or what however you want to go.

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I'm going to direct your question to Mr Ballinger.

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It just happened to be looking up and down the dial so I see the map that's in front of me is the same map that's up there.

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a computer. How can I do that, and had, that'd be visible to me.

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Just use myself as an example.

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I do have all of that but I'm just asking them

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there a way to

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them could print them on request print them on request. Okay.

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Please also view them at the county library or district office. Okay, so any one of the county libraries would have those.

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Yes, because they're available online. Okay.

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Yes, ma'am.

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I don't want to be presumptuous to fully understand what our question was from a member of the audience but

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I'm feeling that to be dynamically engaged in the discussion will be very helpful to see Matt contracting maps together.

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I can understand why don't want to print out 17 minutes, but hopefully in the future when our next meeting when we come in and we're talking about say three specific maps that were able to see them either on the screen or in paper.

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Did that help address your concern, ma'am.

Go to the meeting, and look at council land, there was a threat of lawsuits, and somebody was saying this, this, this idea of the emphasize emphasizing

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different ethnic groups.

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And he stood there.

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He took the map load it says My wife is a teacher and I but Lodi needs to be one district.

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It was really cool because we need to unified divide and conquer is a certain political group that I want to say, but

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looking like divide and conquer.

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Thank you for your input. Thank you.

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Mr Jaffe.

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Now for them. The main event of the draft map so we've been talking about, or mini many weeks now, I think.

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So, the agenda for this portion of the presentation. Just a refresher quickly on the fair maps act, and then jump into the three draft plans, and then talk through next steps and talk through your discussions of those, those draft maps and the revisions

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you'd like to see be made before our next meeting.

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So all of these Matt draft maps are coming before you will meet the fair maps Act requirements and be compliant with the federal Voting Rights Act, and just a

refresher of those four maps Act requirements is one we want the districts to be relatively

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equal in size, and we have that tool at 10% deviation tool to help balance these other elements of the fair maps act all the districts have to be contiguous, they have to know hopping or jumping.

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There's no hopping or jumping. They need to maintain communities of interest.

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They need to follow city instances as a place boundaries, as much as practical practical. And they, their appearance should be compact.

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Now, everything, all the maps were, or providing you are complying with all of those criteria.

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But the biggest thing we need his feedback from you on those rough clients, and to get towards that recommended map to the Board of Supervisors.

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And to get towards that recommended map to the Board of Supervisors. Now, there's just, I just wanted to go through some of the overarching themes that we've had throughout the our outreach hearings, and through, through discussions from this commission.

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One is really the idea of uniting Tracy and Mountain House.

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Now, actually, before I go through all of these, I just want to point out that these are themes.

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They don't have to be followed in every map, and you know you can disregard regard some of them if you'd like, depending on.

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So uniting Tracy and Mountain House in a district to respect the rural and agricultural areas, and their unique interests within the county, like recreating that a western and eastern rural district.

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The possibility of creating a commuter district and linking Mountain House to Tracy and to Western Ranjan, and South Stockton, and then just the understanding that Stockton must be split due to its population size.

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And that, to divide the divide Stockton we could look to the Lodi USD lines or major thoroughfares or neighborhood lines.

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So those are the overarching themes and

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the next thing I wanted to show you is just the current lines as a way to start.

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You can see, starting in the south district five has Mountain House Tracy and portions of both laser laser up and Mantega moving north into district three, you have a majority of laser open Antica

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in District Four, you have again that kind of that seven with Lodi and the eastern portion of the county included.

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and then district one into split Stockton district one is a southern socked in seed with French camp in it.

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Whereas district two is the northern Stockton seat.

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And just reminding you of our current deviations.

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Because of the growth in district five.

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You, it is 14.1% overpopulated according to the ideal population at this point. Whereas District Four we even though it did grow it didn't keep pace with the rest of the county.

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And so it is under populated by 7.6%.

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So you have that 21.7% total deviation, which means that your current lines are out of compliance and we have to be here, making changes.

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So the first draft plan.

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What we like to do when, whenever we conduct a redistricting is start with publicly submitted maps and plans and try to elevate them to be compliant with all of the

criteria we've gone through.

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And so that's what we've done working with working as a team.

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We've selected three publicly submitted maps to elevate and to slightly alter to be in compliance. The first one is map ID for 8331.

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This plan A.

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So you can see this is the disruptor version of Plan A.

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And the, The the final draft map is here to again starting from the south.

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This, this plan unites Tracy and Mountain House keeps later Poland district five moves meant well has been Tikka hole with the eastern part portion of the district as accounting excuse me in district three, and has kind of a northern rural district based

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in Lodi with parts of northern Stockton included district two has the Delta, as part of the Delta and and and is northern Stockton.

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Now you'll see that district one in this plan. This is the seed that we've been talking about it's the federally compliant, or the CRA compliant district.

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It is identical and all three plans.

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So it includes.

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Now starting does not include French. French camp and.

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And basically, it doesn't change throughout the throughout these plans so we can talk more about. If you'd like to see the implications of changing it.

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So then I want to have

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It comes down into Stockton for region, know a few prior slides you mentioned that

a principal was essentially using the Lodi school district boundaries, as an edge.

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Does that boundary but for District Four in Stockton correspond with the Lodi school district boundary.

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It's close but not exactly now, but it's it's used as a guide to some extent.

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And then in men, this is the same plan, but instead of the city's being shaded. Now the current district lines are shaded. So you can see the differences.

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The draft district lines are are outlined in black.

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So you can see that the major change in this in district five from the current is that includes lay through all but not none of Mantega that District Four is is has Lodi for the Northern District has Lodi in it, but doesn't include the eastern section

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and district three is

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is basically Mantega Escalade and ribbon.

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And you can see that district one has much of the current district one in it.

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It just excluded some of the agrarian portion or the rural portions. Northwest in Stockton proper. And it's also moved the more rural areas throughout the district.

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Out of District one

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district to also is is different because it includes the Delta now instead of going north and being more of just stopped in itself.

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So, this is the.

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You can see the the population and citizen voting age population of District a part sorry Plan A.

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You can see the total deviation is 4.2%, well within the 10% range.

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And you can see that the district one Latino see value is 50.3, which will be, again, same throughout all of the draft plans.

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Moving over to draft plan B.

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Again, this was a publicly submitted plan it's 49 596.

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And with this, this plan, one of the themes that has been talked about a lot is to try to give voice to the rural communities.

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And this is, I think, an effort to do that.

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You have like a Northern District surrounded surrounding Lodi.

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You have the Southern District, the magenta district, that includes Tracy and goes all the way over to Ripon in NASSCOM. I think there was a lot of discussion of this in Lodi when we were there last.

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And then you have the, the teal district that has parts of later boom and Tikkun and. And again you have the to Stockton based districts.

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Here is the elevated version of the, of the plan where we've included the district one.

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That's a VR a component at 50.3% Latino see that.

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But we have incorporated most of the elements of the public math. Can you see district five goes from Tracy to ask on district three it's kind of a wraparound district around Stockton, and I think the interesting thing was this district this map is that

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it.

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Mountain House is linked to lay through a men Tika and intellect into a district of London, which is a very different construction than the current lines, and you have

district for another district, based in with Lodi a hole in it, and northern Stockton,

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as an element and I think this is the one that includes.

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Well, it's all inclusive in Stockton, except for the pockets.

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within Stockton that aren't part of the city.

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Again, here is the current district lines.

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With this, this plan superimposed on it.

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I don't know if anybody has questions.

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But do we do, we have a map that actually shows breakdown where those lines fall. Yes, I have an HTML version so if we want to go into boundary boundaries were like what streets, boundaries are, I can pull up the HTML and we can do men.

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Okay.

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That'd be great. So, let me just get through the three and then we can start. Yes.

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So again, here's the breakdown of Plan B.

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And this deviations a little bit higher, it's 7% total deviation.

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Again, you can see that district ones Latinos the vibe is 50.3%.

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The final draft plan that we've.

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We'd like to present is the district or map id 5541.

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And you can see here, this, this district see plan, it has the best seven that we keep saying, and Tracy Mountain House kind of current division of labor of I'm

Antica and district five.

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Now, you'll see that this is the, the elevated draft plan is very different because of a lot of couple different things but one of the things being the section to see which is here district for that really and pause the shift that needed to be done to

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make this compliant.

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And instead of having an overarching seven.

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It stops short right it has the eastern part and district one and Lodi and lock for it and Victor, but it doesn't go all the way up to the northern border, including Dogtown a combo and color Ville.

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Instead, what happens is district five, kind of does the reverse and Mountain House Tracy, and all the way up to the north east, Eastern corner of the district.

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And this really has the most interesting I think district three option where you have Ripon Antica and Lathrop all whole within district three.

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and it having an, including French camp.

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And then comes in, comes up and take some Marotta and Waterloo.

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This plan was really defined by trying to keep as many cities whole as possible.

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And using kind of that architecture of the district or map in, in as much as possible.

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Again, here's the plan C superimposed on the current district lines.

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I would say that this is the district plan that has the most differences from, from the current lines.

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Do you still have a district five that includes Tracy and Mountain House but it goes all the way north to the top of the county.

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You'd have, I think, instead of this is called district one it's for its District Four.

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It's a little bit smaller.

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And then district one into or somewhat similar to the current lines. But the biggest difference is that district three, that, that includes Ripon Mantega Lathrop.

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And part of the rural areas around Stockton.

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So this district plan has a total deviation of 7% so it's very similar to be population balancing, and again in this district, or this plan District Four is the VR a seat, and it's the map is at 50.3.

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So, with that, I just want to go through the, what you can expect from us going forward, that these plans are online now that the public can make comment to on them.

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And they that those comments will be taken in as we can consider it as we go forward to the next year and where we have revised district plans.

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And that all the maps as Commissioner Oscar pointed out will be analyzed for VR a compliance and and full data set will be provided. So you can understand which ones might work if you want to elevate elevate those for the next meeting.

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And everything we're doing is working towards that selection of a wreck recommended plan to the Board of Supervisors.

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And I just wanted to provide the timeline so today's The 13th will be coming back within two weeks.

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For our next rack meeting. The revised draft plans will come out a week prior on the 20th for your review and for the public's review.

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And then we'll have our final meeting on the 10th, where you'll recommend a plan to the, to the Board of Supervisors, and then the board will take it from there.

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Now what I would love to do is go through changes questions on the, the draft maps, I have each of the plans as HTML versions that we can zoom in and zoom out, so you can see major streets and the divisions.

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So could you just throw up the maps just real quickly and you have given us the price,

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have a comment and I think I

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like do you want to start with this like map district three or districts don't care which one they are with.

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When we started the start.

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So we'll start with Plan A.

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warning sorry.

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Okay, what I was gonna say, if you're talking about protection of coin and you look at this map here this is probably the one map that protects all agricultural land.

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If you're looking at the three areas one five and three again.

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Those are your, your three areas that continue to stay but one and five, along with with three, protect all

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in the county

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grand scheme. This is a very interesting map, because it's.

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I had envisioned and real plus of it is that there is significant ag land in three of the districts ice.

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My concern for district five. Is that because of the population in Tracy and Mountain House area that it will dominate, it would dominate the ISIS attention.

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Oh, the Ag and rural areas of delta, and the northern part of the county.

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But get much chin so while ag is in there, that it would be

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risky.

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Yes, there's a river islands in five in that scenario or is it not.

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District five is partially as under the current scenario you have three five and

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I assume that that answer your question, sir.

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Chris going off of the previous comment about dominating and dilution we talked a little bit about this in Lodi this question that was raised of if you, if you consolidate all of the rural elements into a fewer number.

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Words an anti dilution to use the terminology strategy, let's consolidate the ag into the fewer fewest number of districts so that they are guaranteed to have at least one or two seats where there's a significant a presentation of Ag.

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The concern is if you do it the other way.

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You say, Well, let's divide ag equally among all the districts, so that every single district has some. The question of which is stronger and offline we had a conversation.

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I would like to just to clarify that for the record, insofar as questions of dilution are concerned.

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Is it generally considered for an interest, like, of any kind, none necessarily act in general if you have a coin.

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If you share it among many districts load I moved into a short presentation everywhere.

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Where is it considered stronger to consolidate it so that it's insured, to have a voice.

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I think to answer that question instead of thinking about stronger or weaker.

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I look back to the fair maps act, an idea with a fair maps act is that you unify Can you have interest in one district, so that its voice is most present for the elected representative of it.

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So, from that spirit and from what the fair maps act is done. I think its guidance would be to put as much as a community of interests in a hole in one district, rather than distributing its interests to the multiples.

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I think the the secondary idea of having rural portions and every district is something that kind of predated the notion of the fair maps act.

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And it's just a different side of the coin and ask a follow up, please. or Can I ask a follow up please Yes, go right ahead, playing off that response which is what I anticipated is that you would more than likely want to have.

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And I know it sounds counterintuitive and I just wanted to have this open issue addressed, which having ag in more districts hurts ag is the simplest way to kind of describe that.

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In other words, you are diluting as interest if you split it up among all five districts so putting it into.

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Again, this is a very generalized with all the caveats that are necessary.

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In principle, we are trying to show a fewer number of districts, or consolidate that into a smaller number of districts to elevate the voice within those districts.

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So that was that is the context of my question. Could we see an analytic tool, wherein we could look at let's say this draft map see with population as represented as a heat map feature.

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So, the concern I have I agree with, with Commissioner hi back five seems interesting to me, it seems like a kind of a calm, you kind of accomplish what

we're talking about here, that in district five and one, you have two districts with a significant

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amount of agriculture present. that's good.

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My concern, then, is for agriculture, with district five really ultimately diluted because you have such a high percentage of the population, Justin Tracy that you're essentially silencing this consolidation of agriculture in the north and west of the

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county by.

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So if I could see a heat map that showed me how much of District five by population is in Tracy amount house. That would tell me whether I felt confident porting a map.

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That was so predominated by Tracy, but that had a huge amount of the agriculture in the same district, like would that negate that consolidation effect.

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Does that make sense. Yeah, and I can, I can produce it right now but I can get that to basically if we can have it by the next meeting that will be just, just a point you are going to pick up a lot of agricultural and soft Mantega, all the way to the

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river, and then all the way up, and then get their mission.
