Significant Events To-Date

January 26, 2021 – 2021 Supervisorial Redistricting Plan approved

- Timeline assumed Redistricting Data available by July 31, 2021
- Redistricting Advisory Committee (RAC) established

February 12, 2021 – US Census Bureau revised delivery date of Redistricting Data to September 30, 2021

- 30 additional days may be needed at State Data Center
- Redistricting Data now expected by October 30, 2021

March 23, 2021 – Appointment of RAC members

Deadline to complete local redistricting remains December 15, 2021

- CRC State redistricting potentially extended until February 14, 2022
- Senate Bill 594 (Glazer) introduced February 28, 2021, but no local deadline extension yet



CONSULTANTS UPDATE

Redistricting Consultant

- To assist staff and RAC establishing districts in accordance with law
- RFP underway
 - Expected release March 26, 2021
 - Expected kick-off June 1, 2021

Project Management Consultant

- To assist staff overseeing the Redistricting Consultant
- Existing PO for similar services to be used
 - Expected start mid-March, 2021



RAC UPDATE

Composition of Members:

- Originally 2 members per Supervisorial District
- Adding 1 alternate member per Supervisorial District
 - To facilitate a quick transition if existing member unable to serve
 - Alternates are required to attend each RAC meeting

What is redistricting?

Every ten years, districts must be redrawn so that each district is substantially equal in population. This process, colled redistricting, is important in ensuing that each board member expresents about the same number of constituents. In San Joaquin County, the Board of Supervisors is responsible for adopting supervisorial districts, and are forming a Redistricting Advisory Committee comprised of 10 members of the public to develop candidate plans. Redistricting will be based on data from the U.S. Census, expected to be released by September 30. 2021. For the County, the redistricting process must be completed by December 15, 2021.

REDISTRICTING

Every ten years, after the federal census, San Joaquin County must reestablish Supervisorial districts to reflect new population data and shifting populations.

Why does redistricting matter to me?

Redistricting determines which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a district for purposes of electing a board member. The Board of Supervisors will seek input in selecting the next district map for our supervisorial districts. You have an opportunity to share with the Board of Supervisors how you think district boundaries should be drown to best represent your community.

What criteria will our Board of Supervisors use when drawing district lines?

To the extent practicable, district lines will be adopted using the following criteria:

- Geographically contiguous districts (each supervisorial district should share a common border with the next)
- The geographic integrity of local neighborhoods or communities shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division
- Geographic integrity of a city shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division
- Easily identifiable boundaries that follow natural or artificial barriers (rivers, streets, highways, rail lines, etc.), and
 Lines shall be drawn to encourage geographic compactness

In addition, boundaries shall not be drawn for purposes of favoring or discriminating against a political party.

- November 16, 2021 BOS Public Hearing #4, receive draft maps, comments & revise
- November 20, 2021 RAC Public Hearing #5, create final maps, comments & revise
- December 7, 2021 BOS Public Hearing #6, receive final maps & comments
- December 14, 2021 BOS Public Hearing #7, approve final map

December 15, 2021 Last day to approve final map
