BRIEFLY STATE YOUR EXPERIENCE THAT YOU FEEL WOULD BE HELPFUL FOR THE CATEGORY FOR WHICH YOU ARE APPLYING:

When I retired in 2019 as President of University of the Pacific, my husband and I chose to live in this county that we grew to love over the prior decade. We moved from a home on Pacific Ave to living in a 1940s farmhouse surrounded by cherry orchards. The diversity of our county - from the vibrant agricultural regions to the metropolitan cities - requires appropriate district boundaries that assure that the diverse people and needs of San Joaquin County are fairly represented in our local government. It would be an honor for me to serve on the Redistricting Advisory Committee. If appointed, I would bring my experience helping committees of people with diverse viewpoints reach a consensus, understanding analysis and modeling of data, and experience partnering with people across our county. My career in academics included teaching mechanical engineering and leading University of the Pacific for ten years. Nearly every decision in academe is made with input from a committee. My strength has been listening to diverse opinions, finding common ground, promoting respect, and helping committees reach a consensus that well-represents the best collective thinking of the group. Redistricting recommendations should be informed by demographic data. My experience as an engineer and business leader interpreting data and analytic models will help the committee's effort. I will also bring a deep affection for San Joaquin County to this committee. Thanks to my leadership on Beyond our Gates, a group of over 100 leaders in San Joaquin County committed to improving early literacy in the region, I worked with wonderful people from across our county. It was these dedicated individuals - from school districts, Delta CC, non-profit organizations, churches, foundations, businesses and city and county governments - that helped me understand the needs and the great opportunities in this county.

During my leadership at UOP, I established Beyond our Gates to enhance early literacy in San Joaquin County.
